This session will explore the relevant laws and administrative rules around non-resident services, as well as offering insights into some of the more common questions and scenarios including Cards for Kids, non-resident fee card calculations, and more. At the end of this session, participants will have a better understanding of the laws and administrative rules related to non-resident services; Understand recent legislation around non-resident services including Cards for Kids and the option for boards to waive the non-resident fee for ALL children 18 and under; and Know where to find resources related to non-resident services
