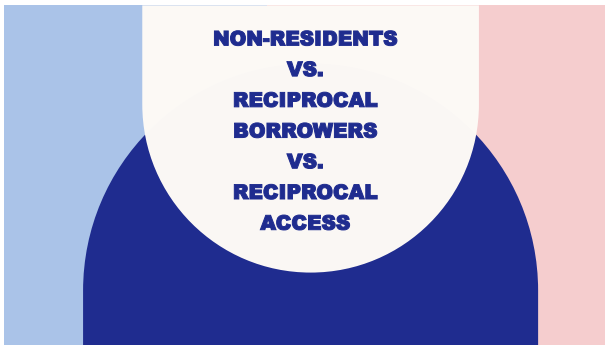
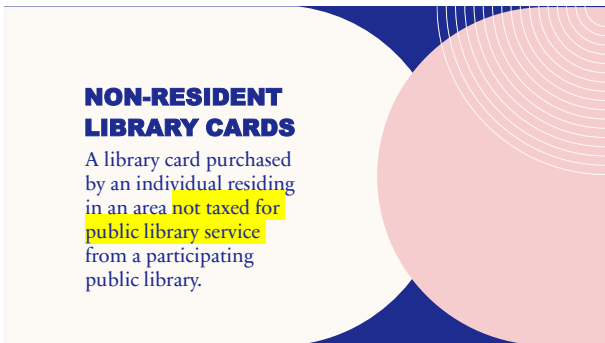

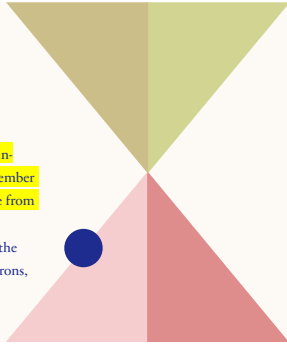

RECIPROCAL BORROWING

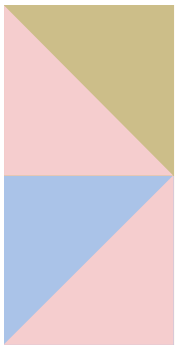
The right of a person who holds a valid, in-good-standing library card from a full member public library to borrow materials on site from other library system full member public libraries under the same conditions that the library provides those materials to its patrons, subject to reasonable restrictions.

RECIPROCAL ACCESS

The resources of all full member libraries of a library system are made available to all library patrons in the system area.

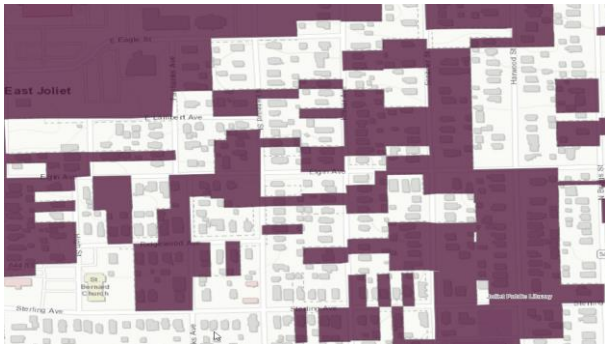
ILLINOIS PUBLIC LIBRARY SERVICE AREA POPULATIONS

NON-RESIDENT FEE CARD METHODS




#1 MATHEMATICAL FORMULA

Divide the library's total property tax income by the local population.

Multiply that result by the average number of people per household to get the nonresident fee.


Use the most recent federal census data for population and household size.



#2 TAX BILL METHOD

The library's tax rate is multiplied with the valuation of the nonresident's property assessment.

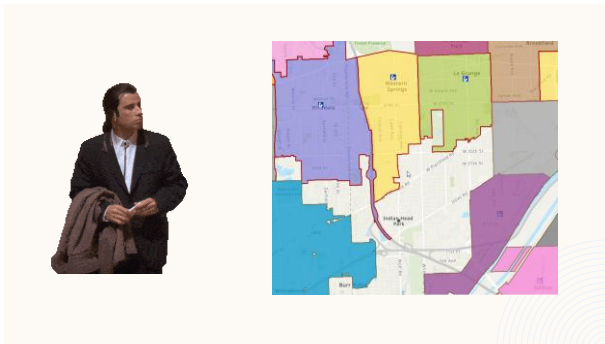
The nonresident must bring their most recent tax bill when this method is used.



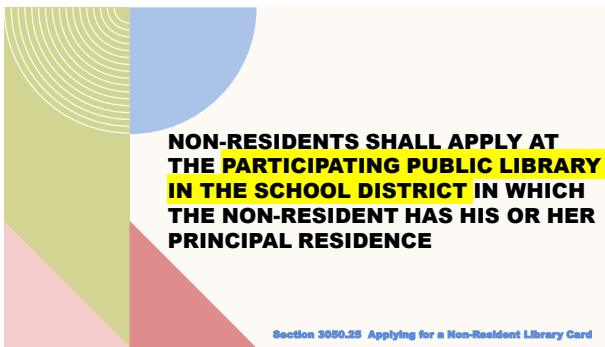
#3 AVERAGE RAILS NON-RESIDENT FEE

The average non-resident fee in the system in which the library is located.

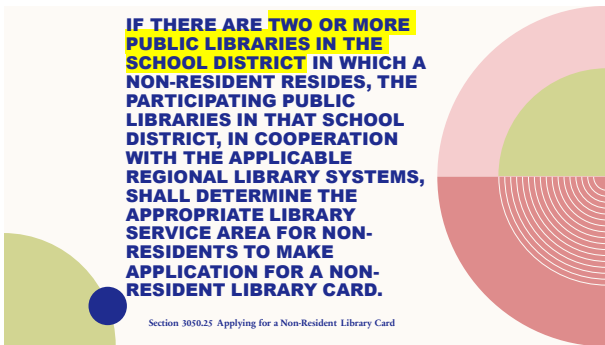

About the Program

The new Cards for Kids Act is an amendment to Illinois Public Library Non-Resident Services that allows students in prekindergarten through 12th grade to obtain a library card with full borrowing privileges free of charge if they:

- Live in unincorporated Elk Grove Township
- Attend schools in Elk Grove Village
- Participate in the Federal Free and Reduced-Price Meal Program at school



Cards covered by this Act will only be registered in a student's name and are good for one year.

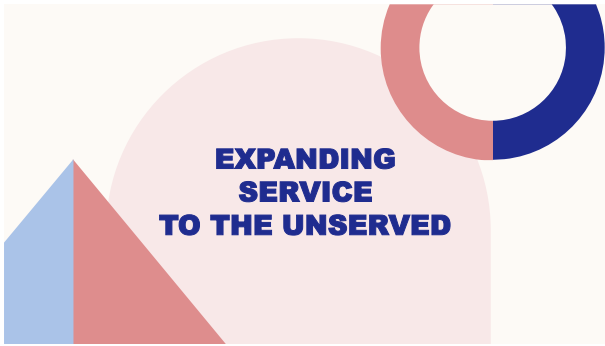

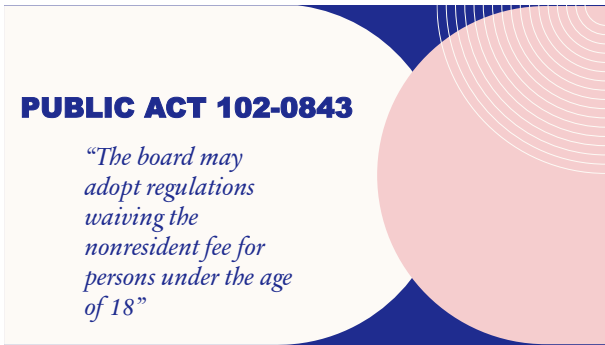
Step 1
Parent and student stop in the Elk Grove Village Public Library and visit the Circulation Services Desk with the information listed below:

- Current valid identification*
- Letter of free and reduced lunch eligibility received from the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE). If you have misplaced this letter, please request documentation from your school. Illinois State Law requires this information to

Exemptions

A fee for an unincorporated library card shall not be charged to:

- children aged 18 and younger who do not reside within incorporated Northbrook
- veterans with a service-connected disability of at least 70% who is exempt from paying property taxes on their primary residence or who rents in an unincorporated area.
- the unmarried surviving spouse of a veteran who qualified for this exemption prior to death.
- an unmarried surviving spouse of a service member killed in the line of duty.

Qualifying veterans or surviving spouses must present documentation that indicates their residence is exempt from paying property taxes. The veteran shall present documentation of at least 70% disability from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

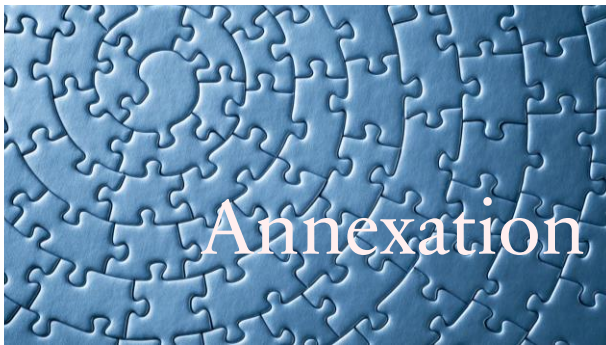

May a public library issue a pro-rated library card to a non-resident who wants to use the library for only a few months?

NO. The administrative rules specify that the non-resident card shall be issued for 12 months.

May a public library issue non-resident cards at no charge to all students in a school district?

Yes....through an IGA or other board action. Public library boards have the authority to enter into intergovernmental agreements to provide non-resident service to other private or public entities, such as a school district.

Can a non-resident who owns or leases property in a library service area obtain a non-resident library card?

YES. The non-resident fee shall be waived upon annual presentation of the most recent tax bill

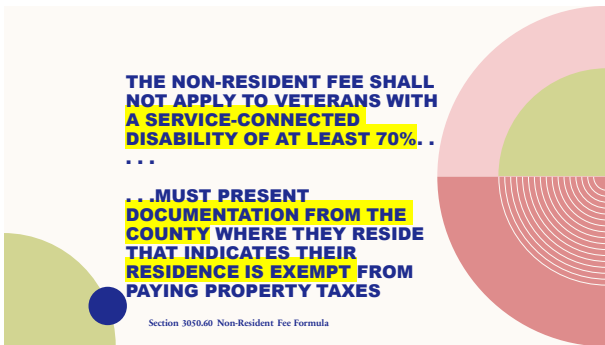


