

Add a call number index for searching

Currently, call number searching is only available through the "All" search index. This enhancement would allow for a dedicated call number index.

Include wildcard search option or browse option for call number searching


At present, call number searches must be entered exactly and completely. This enhancement would allow for wildcard or browse-style searching to improve usability.

Index volume record statements to be searchable

This proposal requests the indexing of volume record statements to make them searchable, as was available in Encore.


IUG | Member Enhancement Process


- •IUG member libraries vote to prioritize enhancements.

Brief RAILS Update



HB 1910 (Opioid Antagonists Amendment)



Proposed by a high school student in Elgin, IL, this bill amends the Illinois Local Library Act



Approved by Legislature on 6/17, expected to be signed soon by the Governor



Requires all public libraries to stock opioid antagonists (like naloxone)



Requires that at least one staff member on duty at any time is trained to administer the medication

- Illinois Department of Public Health will identify organizations qualified to offer training
- Local Health Departments will supply the naloxone to libraries
- Law includes liability protections for library staff acting in good faith when administering the drug
- Questions remain regarding Library Districts, as this law amends the Local Library Act, but not the Library District Act
- RAILS is following this situation closely and will provide legal and administrative guidance when the bill is signed and more is known
